## Cyanotype Prints

### Activity Sheet 6 'How to make'





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#### How to make...a Cyanotype 'sun print'

#### You will need the following materials:

	Cyanotype paper	(you can	buy this	online	or in	art shops)
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- ☐ Acrylic/glass sheet (I use the glass from an old clip frame)
- ☐ Cardboard (a little larger than your Cyanotype paper)
- 4 Bulldog clips or spring clamps
- ☐ Wildflowers or foliage
- ☐ A tray of water or access to a tap
- ☐ A line and pegs for hanging out to dry
  - A paper or card mount for presentation

Note: Cyanotype paper uses potassium ferricyanide which has low toxicity. It is a mild irritant to the eyes and skin. Be careful when using it and dispose of used water down a mains drain and not on the garden!



# Be careful to keep the cyanotype paper sealed in the dark envelope before exposing it in the sun!

- Choose a **sunny day** and get everything ready before you set up your print. **Tip:**UV lamps and torches can also work if there isn't enough sunshine, try
  experimenting with exposure times on a sample piece of paper first!
- Take a sheet of Cyanotype paper out of the black envelope and lay it coloured side up on the cardboard.
- Arrange your flowers or foliage and place the clear acrylic/glass on top holding it in place with the clips.
- Place in full sun for 5 15 minutes or until the paper you can see has faded to close to white.
- Rinse the paper in the tray or under the tap until the water runs clear and then hang out to dry.

**Experiment** - You can try using other objects to make prints too. These look lovely mounted on blank greetings cards!
